

HOW PEDESTRIANS GET HIT IN FLORIDA

The most common ways drivers hit people on foot in Florida.

Motorist Overtaking Crashes (Hit From Behind or Head-On)

A driver hits a pedestrian head-on or from behind, usually while passing too close or driving the wrong way.



Turning Crashes/Failure to Yield

A turning driver hits a pedestrian after failing to yield in a crosswalk or intersection.



Distracted Driver Leaves the Roadway/Sidewalk Accidents

A driver leaves the roadway and hits a pedestrian on the sidewalk or roadside.



Crossing and Crosswalk Crashes

A driver hits a pedestrian crossing at an intersection or crosswalk. Marked or not, they're expected to yield.



Backing Vehicle in Driveway or Parking Lot

A driver backs into a pedestrian without checking the surroundings.
